

# Visual Analysis Cards

## Materials

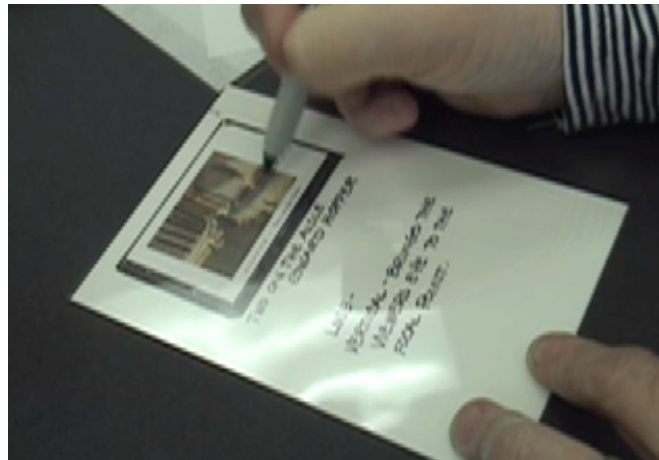
Image of famous artist artwork (cut from magazine or stickers)  
Acetate  
Tracing paper  
Sharpie marker  
Colored pencil  
4" x 6" index card (unlined)

## Procedure

1. Glue the artist image onto a 4"x6" card.
2. Use the Sharpie marker to write the title and artist name below the artwork.
3. Place a piece of 4" x 6" acetate or tracing paper over the image.



4. Select an Element of Art (i.e. line, shape, color, texture, space) and write that at the top of the acetate card. You'll use a different acetate for each element of art.



5. Then find the variations of that element within the image and draw on the acetate to define the element.

6. In the lower space below the image, write about what the element of art that is found within the image. i.e. Line – horizontal, vertical, diagonal, curved.
7. If you'd rather use tracing paper to do this, it works just as well and you can use colored pencils to indicate the various parts.
